## **BRIEF ACCOUNT OF TAMENGLONG COLLEGE**

Tamenglong College was established on 9<sup>th</sup> July 1986 as a private college. Nine years after its inception, it became a full-fledged Government College on 28<sup>th</sup> August 1996. The college, with its motto, “For Nation’s Progress”, has been providing affordable quality and holistic education to all sections of the society, particularly to the students of the district, who are mostly from the remote and far-flung villages. Tamenglong College with its vision, “Empowering the People, enriching cultural heritage and resources for inclusive National Development and lifelong excellence through Higher Education” aims at empowering the people for all-time excellence and progress of the nation through higher education.

## **NAAC Assessment & Accreditation:**

Though the efforts to get the college NAAC assessed and accredited began in the year 2013, its preparation for NAAC Assessment and Accreditation started on war footing by the later part of 2019. After years of planning and preparations, the long-awaited dream of the college to be assessed and accredited by NAAC became a reality. The NAAC Peer Team visited the college on 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> March, 2023 and assessed the college for the period 2017-2022 and thereafter the college was accredited with B grade with the CGPA of 2.01 by NAAC on 10<sup>th</sup>, March, 2023 for a period of five years. College, Tamenglong became a NAAC assessed and accredited college, putting the college among the echelon of elite colleges in the country in terms of Assessment and Accreditation.

## **Present Status:**

Tamenglong College offers two undergraduate courses- BA and B.Sc. Under the BA undergraduate course, the following subjects are offered as honours:

1. English
2. Education
3. Economics
4. History
5. Political science &
6. Sociology

Under B.Sc undergraduate course, the following subjects are offered as honours:

1. Maths
2. Physics
3. Chemistry
4. Botany
5. Zoology
6. Environmental Science
7. Computer Science &
8. Statistics.

There are 317 students enrolled in B.A. and 54 enrolled in B.Sc. in the current academic session.

## **Infrastructure and Man Power:**

There are 21 teachers for the arts stream and 7 teachers for the science stream. The college has 22 class rooms of various sizes. There is a multipurpose hall, a mini-indoor stadium, an open play ground, smart classroom and a library, which housed around 3000 books, besides numerous journals, periodicals and magazines. Computers are available in the college for the students and the staff. IGNOU study center has been opened in the college recently.

## **The College Library**

Tamenglong College has a well set up library with a good collection of books, journals, reference books and other learning resources. Every new academic session, the library is added with new books and it is being upgraded. The college library has 3740 books and 832 journals

and 3 newspapers. It is automated with 21.11 version of KOHA software installed. There are computers with internet connection to cater to the needs of both the teachers and the students. Ultra Tech Technologies has been consulted

for the implementation of Integrated Library Management System (ILMS) in the college's library. The college consistently endeavours to improve facilities of the library in terms of books, journals and other learning materials.

### **Internal Assessment:**

The college conducts Internal Assessment exams throughout the semester as prescribed by the university. The following points should be taken note of with regards to internal assessment.

1. *The Internal Assessment mark shall be of 25 percent of 100*
2. *Generally the Internal Assessment shall consist of 25 marks*
3. *The breakup of marks is as follows:*
  - a. *Class Test - 10 Marks*
  - b. *Presentation - 10 Marks (PPT, Written Assignment, Group Discussion, Field Visitation and Reports etc.)*
  - c. *Attendance and Co-curricular Activities - 5 Marks*

It is mandatory for every student to clear the internal assessment tests and examinations as required by the university to be eligible to sit for external examinations. Any student failing to clear the internal assessment conducted by the college shall be barred from appearing end semester examinations conducted by the university.

### **DISCIPLINE AND ATTENDANCE**

Students are required to adhere strictly to college's rules. The college reserves the right to take disciplinary actions such as fine or expulsion of students whose general conduct and influence are considered detrimental to the best interest of fellow students. Students are responsible for their conduct and they are expected to behave in a manner befitting of a proud collegiate both in and outside the college campus. They are expected not to indulge in practices that will amount to breach of discipline or interference in the normal functioning of the college.

A minimum of 75 percent of attendance is mandatory in every semester per academic session. A student found falling short of the required attendance percentage will be barred from appearing in examinations conducted by the college and the university. The college reserves the right to strike off the names of students failing to meet the minimum attendance requirement (75%).

### **COLLEGE UNIFORMS**

It is mandatory for all the students to procure the following as college uniform:

### **WORKING HOUR:**

The normal working hour of the College is from 9.00 am to 4.00 pm from Monday to Friday. All Saturdays are generally Holidays except on exceptional cases.

### **CENTRES AND CELLS**

#### **INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)**

With the aim of ushering in quality culture in the college, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell was established in 2019 with Namsurei Thomas Kamei, Assistant Professor, Economics department as the Coordinator and David Jiangamlung Kamei, Assistant Professor, English department as the Joint Coordinator. With the initiatives taken up by the IQAC, the college was assessed and accredited with grade B in 2023. The main function of the IQAC is to develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic improvement in the performance of the institution.

#### **IGNOU STUDY CENTRE**

IGNOU Study Centre-1790 was opened in Tamenglong College in February, 2022. The Centre offers BA General, BA (Honours) in Political Science, Sociology and History. MA in History, Sociology, Political Science, and English. A total of 300 students are enrolled in different programmes, currently. NG Tuakeulung, Assistant Professor, English department is the Coordinator.

## NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

The college has an NSS unit with Makhou Gangmei, Asst. Professor, Economics Department as the Programme Officer. The college's NSS Unit organizes various programmes for the NSS volunteers with the aim of inculcating in them the spirit of social commitment through community service and thus develop their personality.

## WOMEN'S CELL

The college has women's cell which organizes various programmes and aims at bringing about awareness on issues related to women. Its focus is the welfare and empowerment of the girl students, the women.

## GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL

To redress the grievances of the students in the campus, the college constituted Grievance Redressal Cell with Daidatlung Kameih, Asst. Professor, Sociology Department as the coordinator. This cell endeavours to identify shortcomings faced by the students and the staff in the campus and rectify them. Thus, it works towards the welfare of all in the college.

## RESEARCH CELL

The college has Research Cell to encourage and promote researches. Ngamtinlun Touthang, Assistant Professor, Political Science department is the coordinator of the cell. With the initiatives from the cell, the college had published a journal entitled, "**Ideas and Insights**" in 2023 and number of teachers are registered for Ph.D. The Research Cell of the college give utmost importance to researches and publications.

## INTER-DEPARTMENTAL ACTIVITIES

Inter-departmental activities are held on Friday of the week wherein students of the various departments are provided the platform to display their talents. Here, students get the opportunities to be organisers, leaders and nurture their potentials to be leaders of the future. Debate, Extempore Speech, Declamation, Quiz, Instant Reading and many other competitions are conducted during the inter-departmental activities.

## NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

The college has started NCC Girls' Cadet in 2023. At present, there are 53 cadets with N Rose Gonmei, Assistant Professor, Department of Education, as the CTO/ANO.
